Cruise Ship: Embarkation Port: Departure Date: When Booking Cruise Decide if you are going to purchase travel insurance. To qualify for full coverage you almost always have to buy travel insurance within 15 days of booking your trip. It can be a good safety net for all your costly non-refundable purchases. 90 Days Before Cruising Apply for a Passport or track down your Passport and/or other required travel documents. Check with your cruise line for their specific requirements. *CRUISIN always recommends travelling with a Passport, even if it's not required. After Final Payment Is Made (typically 30 to 90 days before cruising) Print out any boarding passes / luggage tags and anything else your cruise line may issue to you online. П Make a new cruise playlist for your phone/iPod. Use it while traveling, onboard poolside, in the cabin, etc. П Arrange for any accommodations you will need prior to and/or after the cruise. П Arrange for any required shuttle service(s) to/from port. П Arrange for any needed accommodations for your pets while away. Order any gifts/liquor/etc. through your cruise line. Cutoff date for pre-cruise purchases through a cruise line is usually one to two weeks prior to departure. Make doctor's appointment to get refills on any prescription medications. Book your shore excursions. The popular ones can fill up quickly. It is recommended you book them as early as possible. Make a packing list for the cruise (see general recommendations list below). What To Bring – these are general recommendations, adjust according for cruise length and cruise destination(s).

Casual Clothing

- 2 bathing suits (they don't dry overnight)
- 1 pair of flip flops
- 1 pair of sneakers
- 1 sweatshirt/sweater
- 1 hat or visor
- ? shorts, pants/jeans, shirts, socks, underwear (adjust quantity according to your cruise length)

Formal Clothing

Ladies: Dress or dress slacks and dress shoes Gentlemen: Dress shirt & pants, tie, dress shoes or Suit/Tuxedo

Cruise Line Dress Code

Make sure you are familiar with any dress code your cruise line may have. Whether the code is for dining or any other formal onboard events. You may not be excluded but you may feel out of place if you don't have the recommended attire to wear for the occasion.

Non-clothing

- Cell phone / camera with charger(s)
- Prescriptions
- Non-prescriptions aspirin, ibuprofen, sea sickness pills/patches, antacid, etc.
- Hot/Cold cup with a lid take drinks to and from cabin, easily distinguish from others onboard
- Bug repellant for some shore excursions
- Sunglasses / Sunscreen / Aloe Vera
- Flashlight with extra batteries no need to wake everyone up in the cabin at night
- Febreeze® keeps room and clothes fresh in humid cruising environments
- Downy wrinkle release

*** Try Not To Over Pack ***

If you don't necessarily need it, don't bring it!

Most cruise lines offer laundry services for a fee onboard.

Some cruise lines offer a discounted laundry price mid-cruise.

1 Week Before Cruising	
	Notify banks (debit/credit cards) that you will be travelling, where you will be travelling to and when you will return.
	Call cellular company to get rates for onboard the ship and international rates for countries visiting. Add international roaming if needed. Your cabin phone may be cheaper, check with your cruise line for in cabin phone rate.
	Verify your required travel identification (Passport, birth certificate, etc.) is in hand.
	Pick up prescription medications.
	Arrange to have mail held and suspend newspaper deliveries: <u>USPS - Hold Mail Service</u>
	Print a copy of your itinerary.
	Download to your phone and print a copy of your ship's deck plan. You can find these in CRUISIN's Resources or on your cruise line's website/app
	Leave contact information, ship name and travel dates with family in case of emergency.
	Drop off / pick up dry cleaning for any clothing items you'll be cruising with.
	Notify school that children will be out, ask for work in advance.
	Register with the US Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP): https://step.state.gov/step/
1-2 Days Before Cruising	
	Re-verify with banks (debit/credit cards) that your accounts are noted correctly for international travel
	Pay bills that will come do when you are gone
	Get cash prior to cruising - plenty of small bills for tipping and/or shopping in port(s). You can also at times negotiate lower prices with cash purchases in many port locations. Keep in mind ship and port ATMs typically have higher fees.
	Print any cruise line purchase (gifts / liquor / etc.) confirmations you have already and take them with you.
	Print excursion confirmations to take with you. If you purchased through the cruise line, check their policy for delivery. They may already be in your cabin when you board.
	Pack luggage - Don't over pack! Cruise Packing Rule Of Thumb: "You'll need about half of what you think." Don't forget you'll likely be coming back with more than when you left, leaving room for some travel souvenirs can be important.
	If you are issued luggage tags from your cruise line, attach them to any bags that you will be checking in.
	Print an 8 $\%$ x 11 sheet with your name, address, cabin # and phone # on it and put it inside <u>each</u> piece of luggage in case your luggage tag(s) fall off.
	Confirm any accommodations (hotels, Airbnb, etc.) and transportation services (port shuttles, etc.) you will be using prior to and/or after cruising.
Morning of Departure / Before You Leave Home	
	Turn off or adjust air conditioning / heat & verify doors, windows and gates are locked
	Drop pets off at kennel
	Set garage door on vacation mode (only can be opened from inside)
	Set alarms on cars and house
	Put your keys where you will easily find them after the vacation
	Varify you have all cruice documents, confirmations and required identification with you
